## F. Diagnosis: Stage III

Dear readers,

The following are questions to ask when visiting a doctor if you have been diagnosed with stage three melanoma.

- 1. What criteria led to the diagnosis of stage III?
- 2. What are transit metastases and do I have any?
- 3. Do I have lymph node metastases? If so, how many lymph node stations are affected?
- 4. To what extent has the melanoma spread? Are other organs affected beyond the lymph nodes?
- 5. Will I need additional diagnostics to confirm the stage of melanoma?
- 6. Should I get a second opinion?
- 7. How do you assess my prognosis based on the current state of my melanoma; do you initiate a tumor marker analysis?
- 8. Do you recommend therapeutic lymph node dissection?
- 9. How much experience does the surgeon in charge have with lymph node dissection?
- 10. Do you recommend other surgical procedures?
- 11. Should I consider adjuvant treatments such as chemotherapy and why?
- 12. What are the goals of the treatment?
- 13. What are possible side effects of treatment?
- 14. Will the treatment interfere with my work?
- 15. Should I participate in a clinical trial?
- 16. Are you involved in clinical trials that are important to me?
- 17. Should I contact a center that conducts clinical trials?
- 18. Can I use other supportive or alternative therapies?
- 19. What kind of aftercare will I need?
- 20. Will I need regular imaging techniques?
- 21. How do you assess the risk that other family members will also develop melanoma?
