## G. Diagnosis: stage IV

The following are the questions that may arise during a visit to the doctor if you have been diagnosed with stage four melanoma.

- 1. What criteria led to the diagnosis of stage IV?

- 3. Will I need additional diagnostics to confirm the stage of melanoma; will you arrange for tumor marker analysis?
- 4. Should I get a second opinion?
- 5. How do you assess my prognosis?
- 6. Will surgery be necessary?
- 7. What treatment do you recommend and why?
- 8. Should I consider chemotherapy and/ or immunotherapy as treatment?
- 9. What is the difference between chemotherapy and immunotherapy?
- 10. What are the goals of my therapy?
- 11. What are possible side effects of treatment?
- 12. Will the treatment interfere with my work?
- 13. Will I need radiation?
- 14. Should I participate in a clinical trial?
- 15. Are you involved in other clinical trials that are important to me?
- 16. Should I contact a center that conducts clinical trials?
- 17. Can I use other supportive or alternative therapies?
- 18. What kind of aftercare will I need?
- 19. Will I need regular imaging techniques? Do I need brain imaging?
- 20. Should I consult a dermatologist regularly?
- 21. How do you assess the risk that other family members will also develop melanoma?
